

Leaving a Gift to Racehorse Relief

Why it is important to leave a will.

We all lead busy lives and making a will may not always be your top priority. However, a will is the only legal way you can guarantee that your wishes for your estate and money are adhered to. It ensures that loved ones are taken care of, which wouldn't happen without one. Without a will the law has the right to decide what happens with your estate and

Normally people pick two 'executors', should one not be available when the time comes. An 'executor' is usually a family member or a professional and impartial adviser such as a solicitor.

The three different types of legacies that you can leave in your will:



- <u>Residuary:</u> This is a gift of the remainder of your assets after all other bequests have been made and any debts cleared.
- <u>Pecuniary:</u> This is a gift of a fixed sum of money in your Will.
- **Specific:** This is a particular named item left as a gift in your Will, such as a piece of jewellery, a car, or a house.

If you have already made a will and you've decided to add a gift to Racehorse Relief, then a codicil is a straightforward and inexpensive way to do this. Adding a codicil ensures all other provisions remain the same and it also means you will not have to have your will completely rewritten.

How to make a will:

To minimise costs and to make the process easier it is a good idea to gather the following information and have it ready for your appointment with your solicitor.

- * Two names for your chosen 'executors' of your will.
- * A list of all your assets (e.g. house, cars, savings)
- * A list of your liabilities (e.g. house mortgage, loans, debts)
- * A list of your loved ones and what you would like to bequeath them individually.
- * The names of any charities you would like to leave a gift to. It is important to have their registered charity number and contact details ready.



* A note of what type of gift you would like to leave to each of your beneficiaries (e.g. pecuniary, residuary or specific).
